General Fund (Friends of Mt. Morris)



Mt. Morris receives support in many ways including user fees for services, support from the Moravian Church Western District, the Larger Life Foundation, and support from individuals, churches, and other organizations. Support from individuals is a primary source of giving. Gift support allows Mt. Morris to be very competitive in its rates for services and helps us grow our service of hospitality to campers and guests. Your support to our Friends of Mt. Loan Reduction

In 2004 Mt. Morris purchased approximately 10 acres of farmland on the north side of its property (bordering Little Lake). The Center borrowed funding for this purchase and is currently making monthly payments on this mortgage. You may know this new land as the “Thorstad Property.” Your generous gift to loan reduction will allow a more rapid pay off of this loan freeing up precious resources for direct ministry efforts.



Maintenance and Operations Endowment Fund



Endowment Funds are a very important source of donations for current and future needs. The Maintenance and Operations Endowment provides funds to help maintain the operation of Mt. Morris. Mt. Morris’ policy dictates that we maintain the gifts to this fund intact and annually spend only a small percentage of the growth/interest which allows the gifts made to the Endowment Fund to grow and provide a source of funding for years to come.

Capital Needs and Development Endowment Fund

The Capital Needs and Development Endowment provides funds to support more long range capital projects like new buildings and/or equipment. Mt. Raise the Roof Barn Project

In 2011 the Mt. Morris Board of Directors approved a project to put a new roof, siding, and repainting of the 1930 vintage Barn. The projected cost of the project is \$25,000 and the Board is seeking donations for this worthwhile project to preserve this iconic and historical facility.
